Paint

One warm and one cool of each primary color:

Some examples:

- cadmium red medium, and alizarin crimson
- cadmium yellow medium and hansa yellow
- ultramarine blue and phthalocyanine blue

Plus:

- black
- burnt umber
- Titanium white for acrylics (buy professional grade even if all other paints are student grade) I recommend Liquitex, Golden, or Liquitex Basics

Surface for exercises

For acrylics and oils, you can use a canvas pad, multimedia pad, gessoed watercolor paper, primed mat board, Bristol board or canvas board. For watercolors you can use a block, loose paper, watercolor pad or stretched paper.

Brushes

- Just a few of your favorites in a variety of shapes and sizes
- Palette knife(s) for acrylic and oil
- Rags or Paper towels
- Palette appropriate for your medium
- Water container(s)

Optional

- artist's tape or blue tape
- Ruler and pencil
