## **House Portraits in Ink With Watercolor House Portraits Made Easy**

□ Watercolor paper – 11" x 14" or 16" x 20". The paper should not be overly rough or the ink pen will get caught in the ridges. Canson Montval paper 140 lb. or any other paper is suitable. Bring several sheets.
<ul> <li>□ Black India Ink</li> <li>□ Speedball (or similar brand) point and pen holder. The pen point should be fairly smal (about the size of a medium ballpoint pen). It can be a quill style pen.</li> <li>OR</li> </ul>
☐ Instead of India ink and a dip pen, you could bring a fine tipped marker of <b>India ink quality.</b> (It must say India ink quality, or it may run when watercolor is put on top.) o If not sure, test at home.
o PENSTIX No. 3015-EF 0.5mm (extra fine) or wider o Faber-Castell PITT black 199 artist pen comes in several sizes and 4 packs with a variety of sizes.
□ Ruler - 12 inch
<ul><li>#2 pencil or mechanical pencil</li><li>Clean kneaded rubber eraser or white eraser</li></ul>
Set of watercolors – either tubes or pan. It will be used for the watercolor wash, so any inexpensive set will be sufficient.
□ Watercolor brushes – at least one round medium (#8 to #12).
☐ Plain white paper for testing
□ Clear 8" x 10" photo - o Photos on a phone are too small to serve as a reference., and photos on a table
will not work Print on your home printer or send to a drug store for printing. This
usually costs \$2 or \$3 without a coupon.
